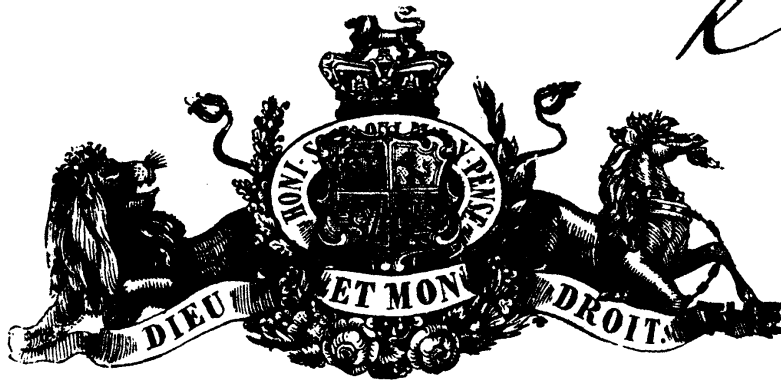

An Act for the Further Appropriation of the Revenue for the Year ended June Thirtieth, One Thousand Nine Hundred and Eleven, and for the General Appropriation of the Revenue for the Year ending June Thirtieth, One Thousand Nine Hundred and Twelve.

[Assented to, March 21st, 1912.]

WHEREAS, by various Acts and Ordinances of the State of Preamble.
South Australia, certain moneys are or may be collected, to be paid to the Treasurer on behalf of His Majesty, His heirs and successors, for the public uses of the said State and support of the Government thereof: And whereas certain other moneys are or may become payable to the said State for the like uses, under the provisions of the Commonwealth of Australia Constitution Act, 63 & 64 Vict., ch. 12—

Be it therefore Enacted by the Governor, with the advice and consent of the Parliament of South Australia, as follows:

1. Out of the said moneys paid by the Commonwealth of Australia, and the produce of all or any other the General Public Revenues of the said State, not otherwise by law specially appropriated, there shall or may be further issued the sum of One Million Five Hundred and Twenty-nine Thousand Two Hundred and Eight Pounds Seventeen Shillings and One Penny. 2. Out of the sum of Five Hundred Thousand Pounds issued under the authority of the Act No. 1034 of 1911, the sum of Five Hundred Thousand Pounds issued under the authority of the Act No. 1038 of 1911, the sum of Eight Hundred Thousand Pounds issued under the authority of the Act No. 1071 of 1911-12, and the said sum of One Million Five Hundred and Twenty-nine Thousand Two Hundred and Eight Pounds Seventeen Shillings and One Penny by this Act authorised to be issued, there shall or may be applied in the manner hereinafter mentioned, any sums of money not exceeding in amount respectively the several sums of money hereinafter specified, that is to say—

Treasurer to pay the orders of Governor, and discharge by receipt of party.

3. The issue and payment by the Treasurer, from time to time, of any sum or sums of money for the purposes hereinbefore mentioned, not exceeding in the whole the sums respectively in that behalf hereinbefore specified, to such persons and in such portions as the Governor has heretofore directed by any order or orders in writing signed by him and countersigned by the Chief Secretary, or may hereafter direct by any order or orders so signed and countersigned, is hereby authorised; and the said Treasurer shall, in his accounts, be allowed credit for all sums paid by him in pursuance of such orders accordingly; and the receipts of the persons to whom such sums shall have been so paid shall be to him a full discharge for the sum or sums for which the same receipts shall have been respectively given, and the amounts thereof shall be passed to his credit in account accordingly.

In the name and on behalf of His Majesty, I hereby assent to this Bill.
