# GEORGII V REGIS.

An Act to further amend the Municipal Corporations Acts and the Licensed Hawkers Acts and for other purposes.

*[Assented to, December 23rd, 1915.]*

**B**E it Enacted by the Governor of the State of South Australia, with the advice and consent of the Parliament thereof, as follows:

1. This Act may be cited as the "Municipal Corporations Act Amendment Act, 1915." Short title.

2. This Act shall be incorporated with the Municipal Corporations Act, 1890, and the Acts incorporated with that Act and all the said Acts and this Act shall be read as one Act. Incorporation with other Acts.

3. Notwithstanding anything to the contrary contained in the Licensed Hawkers Acts, 1863 to 1912, or in section 37 of the Municipal Corporations Amendment Act, 1903, or in any other Act declared to be incorporated herewith, no person (other than a person authorised as hereinafter mentioned) shall hawk or sell or offer for sale any goods or commodity in any street, road, or public place or portion of a street, road, or public place within any Municipality the Council of which has under a by-law made in pursuance of section 36 of the Municipal Corporations Act Amendment Act, 1914, appointed stands in such street, road, public place, or portion for street hawkers and itinerant traders, if any persons have been authorised under any by-law made as aforesaid to occupy such stands, Prohibition of hawking in streets in which stands appointed for street hawkers and itinerant traders.

stands, or such stands are available for allotment as provided by any by-law made as aforesaid. Any person offending against the provisions of this section shall be liable on conviction to a penalty not exceeding Five Pounds, and on a second conviction to a penalty not exceeding Ten Pounds, and on each subsequent conviction to a penalty not exceeding twice the amount of the maximum penalty which might have been imposed on the last preceding conviction.
