An Act to vest a certain Road in the Crown, and for other purposes.

[*Assented to, November 28th, 1923.*]

BE it Enacted by the Governor of the State of South Australia, with the advice and consent of the Parliament thereof, as follows:

1. This Act may be cited as the "Road (Hundred of MacDonnell) Short title. Acquisition Act, 1923."

2. Notwithstanding the provisions of the District Councils Act, 1914, the piece of land delineated in the plan in the Schedule hereto and therein hatched in black, being portion of a public road which, pursuant to the said Act is vested in and is under the care, control, and management of the District Council of Port MacDonnell, shall be deemed to have become vested for an estate of inheritance in fee simple in His Majesty King George V and his successors on and from the seventh day of August, nineteen hundred and twenty-two, and shall, from the said seventh day of August, be deemed to have ceased to be under the care, control, and management of the said District Council, and to have ceased to be a public road. Certain road vested in the Crown.

3. Any instrument being, or expressed to be, an agreement for sale and purchase of any land which includes the said piece of land, executed by the Commissioner of Crown Lands, shall be valid and effectual for all purposes. Validation of dealings with land.

In the name and on behalf of His Majesty, I hereby assent to this Bill.
