An Act to amend the Police Pensions Act, 1929-1947.

[Assented to 9th October, 1949.]

BE IT ENACTED by the Governor of the State of South Australia, with the advice and consent of the Parliament thereof, as follows:

- 1. (1) This Act may be cited as the "Police Pensions Act show states. Amendment Act, 1949".
- (2) The Police Pensions Act, 1929-1947, as amended by this Act, may be cited as the "Police Pensions Act, 1929-1949".
- (3) The Police Pensions Act, 1929-1947, is hereinafter called "the principal Act".
- 2. This Act is incorporated with the principal Act and that Incorporation. Act and this Act shall be read as one Act.
- 3. Section 15 of the principal Act is repealed and the following re-enactment of the normal section is enacted in lieu thereof:—

 Repeal and re-enactment of a. 15 of the principal Act section is enacted in lieu thereof:—

15. (1) Every member who has served in the force for at least ten years and has attained the age of sixty years retirement after retiring shall be entitled—

- (a) on ceasing active service in the force, to a cash payment of one thousand and fifty pounds; and
- (b) on retirement from the force, to a pension during his life of one hundred and fifty-six pounds per annum.

- (2) A member who on the day of the commencement of the Police Pensions Act Amendment Act, 1949, has served in the force for at least ten years, has attained the age of sixty years and has ceased active service in the force, but has not retired from the force shall be entitled—
 - (a) upon the passing of the said Act to a cash payment of one thousand and fifty pounds;
 - (b) on retirement from the force to a pension during his life of one hundred and fifty-six pounds per annum.
