An Act to amend the Vermin Act, 1931-1953.

[Assented to 11th November, 1954.]

BE IT ENACTED by the Governor of the State of South Australia, with the advice and consent of the Parliament thereof, as follows :

1. This Act may be cited as the " Vermin Act Amendment Act, 1954 ". Short titles.

(2) The Vermin Act, 1931-1953, as amended by this Act, may be cited as the " Vermin Act, 1931-1954 ".

(3) The Vermin Act, 1931-1953, is hereinafter referred to as " the principal Act ".

2. Section 23 of the principal Act is amended—

(a) by striking out the word " two " in the eighth line thereof and by inserting in lieu thereof the word " five " ;

(b) by striking out the word " five " in the ninth line thereof and by inserting in lieu thereof the word " ten " ;

(c) by striking out the word " five " in the tenth line thereof and by inserting in lieu thereof the word " fifteen " ;

(d) by striking out the word " twenty " in the tenth line thereof and by inserting in lieu thereof the word " thirty " ;

(e) by striking out the word " twenty " in the eleventh line thereof and by inserting in lieu thereof the word " twenty-five " ;

- (f) by striking out the word "two" in the sixth line of subsection (1a) thereof and by inserting in lieu thereof the word "five";
- (g) by striking out the word "five" in the seventh line of subsection (1a) thereof and by inserting in lieu thereof the word "ten";
- (h) by striking out the word "five" in the eighth line of subsection (1a) thereof and by inserting in lieu thereof the word "fifteen";
- (i) by striking out the word "twenty" in the eighth line of subsection (1a) thereof and by inserting in lieu thereof the word "thirty";
- (j) by striking out the word "twenty" in the tenth line of subsection (1a) thereof and by inserting in lieu thereof the word "twenty-five".
