An Act for the appropriation of revenue of the State for the financial year ending on the thirtieth day of June, 1972, and for other purposes.

[Assented to 14th October, 1971]

BE IT ENACTED by the Governor of the State of South Australia, with the advice and consent of the Parliament thereof, as follows:

Short title.

1. This Act may be cited as the "Appropriation Act (No. 2), 1971".

Further issue

2. Out of the moneys paid to the State by the Commonwealth, and any other General Revenue of the State not otherwise by law specially appropriated, there may be issued and applied such a further sum as will, together with all sums issued and applied pursuant to the Acts (other than this Act) authorizing the issue and application out of the General Revenue of any moneys for the public service of the State for the financial year ending on the thirtieth day of June, 1972, amount to the sum of three hundred and forty-nine million, three hundred and eighty-eight thousand dollars.

Appropriation of General Revenue.

3. (1) The sum of three hundred and forty-nine million, three hundred and eighty-eight thousand dollars referred to in section 2 of this Act is appropriated for the public service of the State for the financial year ending on the thirtieth day of June, 1972, as follows, viz:—

(2) If—

(a) during the financial year ending on the thirtieth day of June' 1972, any increases of salaries or wages become payable by the State pursuant to any return made under the Acts relating to the public service, or pursuant to any regulation or any award, order or determination of a court or other body empowered to fix salaries or wages;

and

(b) those increases were not provided for in the estimates of expenditure for that financial year,

the Governor may, by warrant under section 32a of the Public Finance Act, 1936, as amended, appropriate out of the General Revenue of the State such amounts as are equal to those increases, and those appropriations shall be additional to the appropriations made by virtue of subsection (1) of this section, and the aggregate amount which may be appropriated under section 32a of the Public Finance Act, 1936, as amended, for that financial year shall be increased by the amount appropriated pursuant to this subsection.

(3) The Governor may, by warrant under section 32a of the Public Finance Act, 1936, as amended, appropriate out of the General Revenue of the State any money required to meet further

expenditure beyond the amounts provided in the estimates of expenditure for the financial year ending on the thirtieth day of June, 1972, for costs of electricity supplied to the Engineering and Water Supply Department for pumping water through the Mannum-Adelaide pipeline, the Morgan-Whyalla pipeline and the Swan Reach-Stockwell pipeline, and the aggregate amount which may be appropriated under section 32a of the Public Finance Act, 1936, as amended, for that financial year shall be increased by the amount appropriated pursuant to this subsection.

4. The issue and payment by the Treasurer, from time to time, Treasurer to pay the orders of any sums of money for the purposes hereinbefore mentioned, not of Governor. exceeding in the whole the amount hereinbefore specified, in such portions as the Governor directs by any orders in writing signed by him and countersigned by the Chief Secretary, is hereby authorized: and the Treasurer shall, in his accounts, be allowed credit for all sums paid by him in pursuance of such orders accordingly; and the receipts of the persons to whom such sums are so paid shall be to him a full discharge for the sums for which the receipts are given, and the amounts thereof shall be passed to his credit in account accordingly.

5. If the moneys paid to the State by the Commonwealth and Power to issue money other the General Revenue of the State are insufficient to make the than revenue payments authorized by section 3 of this Act, moneys may be received from the Commonissued to make good the deficiency out of loan funds or other public funds or out of moneys raised by way of bank overdraft.

6. The Treasurer may—

Power to make payments.

(a) out of the moneys appropriated by this Act and included in the estimates of expenditure for the financial year ending on the thirtieth day of June, 1972;

or

(b) out of any money which may be appropriated pursuant to subsection (2) of section 3 of this Act,

make any payment notwithstanding that the payment is in respect of a period prior to the first day of July, 1971.

7. The Treasurer may out of the account in the Treasury known Expenditure from Hospitals as the "Hospitals Fund" expend such sums as may, in accordance with any Act, be available therein for the purposes of the provision, maintenance, development and improvement of public hospitals and equipment for public hospitals: But such expenditure shall not exceed in the aggregate—

(a) during the financial year ending on the thirtieth day of June, 1972, the sum of five million, one hundred and fifty thousand dollars:

(b) during the period between the thirtieth day of June, 1972, and the commencement of the Act for the appropriation of revenue of the State for the financial year ending on the thirtieth day of June, 1973, the sum of one million, seven hundred thousand dollars.

Payments to be in addition to other payments.

8. Any amount appropriated by this Act may be paid for the purpose for which it is so appropriated, in addition to any other amount appropriated by law for that purpose.
