An Act to amend the Film Classification Act, 1971-1973.

[Assented to 5th December, 1974]

BE IT ENACTED by the Governor of the State of South Australia, with the advice and consent of the Parliament thereof, as follows:

- 1. (1) This Act may be cited as the "Film Classification Act Amendment short titles. Act, 1974".
- (2) The Film Classification Act, 1971-1973, is hereinafter referred to as "the principal Act".
- (3) The principal Act, as amended by this Act, may be cited as the "Film Classification Act, 1971-1974".
 - 2. Section 6 of the principal Act is amended—
 - (a) by striking out subsection (5) and inserting in lieu thereof the following subsections:-
 - (5) Where a film to which a restricted classification has admitted to been assigned is being, or is about to be, exhibited in a theatre, films bearing the exhibitor, an employee of the exhibitor, or a member of the classification. police force may-
 - (a) require any person who seeks admission to the theatre, or who is in the theatre to state his correct age;

and

- (b) where the exhibitor, employee, or member of the police force, suspects that the age as stated may be incorrect, require that person to produce satisfactory evidence of his age.
- (5a) Where a film to which a restricted classification has been assigned is being, or is about to be, exhibited in a theatre, and the exhibitor, an employee of the exhibitor, or a member of the police force suspects upon reasonable grounds that a person who is in the theatre is between two and eighteen years of age he may—

- (a) require that person to leave the theatre forthwith; and
- (b) where that person fails to comply with that requirement, use reasonable force to remove that person from the theatre.;

and

(b) by striking out from subsection (7) the passage "subsection (6)" and inserting in lieu thereof the passage "subsection (5) or subsection (5a)".
